PURPLE, RED 1, RED 2, ORANGE, as defined by HHSJ	Fire and Emergency First Response Unit (FFRU) (if available and incident is accessible)	Ambulance resources as appropriate for the incident, including PRIME if appropriate	By Ambulance Comms to Firecom when the incident is classified as 'PURPLE', 'RED' incidents where Fire and Emergency can arrive ahead of an ambulance resource, or 'ORANGE' incidents where Fire and Emergency can arrive ahead of an ambulance resource, where the clinical skill set of a first responder may make a positive difference to patient outcome or where vulnerable patients (such as elderly who have fallen) and patients who are exposed to environmental factors that make them prone to deterioration prior to ambulance arrival. (as determined by HHSJ at time of call)
